About Natstand family documents:

A Natstand family document is intended to provide background information concerning the family of a deceased naturalist. It is hoped that such information will form a framework which will help interpret their surviving correspondence, specimens and records. In some cases it will also give an insight into the influences on their early lives and the family constraints within which they worked and collected. We have found that published family data concerning individuals rarely contain justification for dates and relationships and not infrequently contain errors which are then perpetuated. The emphasis in Natstand family documents will be on providing references to primary sources, whenever possible, which will be backed-up with transcriptions.

Although a Natstand biography page will always carry a link to a family document, in many cases these documents will be presented without any further biographical material. We anticipate that this will occur if the person is particularly well known or is someone we are actively researching or have only a peripheral interest in.

The following conventions are used:

Any persons in the family tree with known natural history associations will be indicated in red type. Any relationships will be to the root naturalist unless otherwise stated.

Dates are presented Year – Month – Day

e.g. **1820 March 9** or **1820.3.9**
1820 March or **1820.3**

Dates will be shown in bold type if a reliable reference is presented in the document. In cases where an exact year cannot be given (e.g. it is derived from an age at death), the date will be presented in normal type and preceded with "c" – e.g. c1798. There are some cases where a date is available from a secondary source only (e.g. a published obituary), in these cases it will be presented in italics – e.g. *1823.7.21*

Data sources:

Census data have been used, whenever possible, to confirm relationships; they are not considered a reliable source of data concerning age. Contemporary newspaper family notices are considered as reliable sources of relationships and dates; reports and obituaries are treated more cautiously. Parish records generally provide a reliable source of data and digitised images have been used whenever possible. Any difficulties with transcription will be made clear. In some cases only transcripts have been available; errors here are usually confined to spelling. The most important source of this material is the International Genealogical Index compiled by The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints, Utah. National Civil Registration Indexes are considered reliable, as are probate records.

The Buckland family is noted for its contribution to the fields of geology and natural history. The most celebrated and obvious members are **Rev William Buckland (1784 – 1854) DD, Dean of Westminster**, and his son **Francis (Frank) Trevelyan Buckland (1826 – 1880)**. Other naturalists appearing in this pedigree include –

Mary Morland (1797 - 1857) The wife of Dean William Buckland, DD, and mother of Frank Buckland. She was also a respected palaeontologist and illustrator in her own right.

Charles Thomas Buckland (1824 – 1894) nephew of Dean Buckland

Rev Henry Doddridge Gordon (1833 – 1897) son-in-law of Dean Buckland

Mary Oke Buckland (1829 - 1918) niece of Dean Buckland (Tasmania)

THE LATE REV. J. R. BUCKLAND.
The Head Master of the Hutchins School, the Rev. John Richard Buckland, is no more. His death was not unexpected. For some months past the state of his health has caused serious apprehension among his friends, who may be said to include everyone, who had the pleasure as well as the advantages of an acquaintance with this high-minded and scholarly English gentleman. The deceased was the son of the Rev. John Buckland, rector of Templeton, in the County of Devon, and consequently the nephew of the celebrated Dean of Westminster of the same name. By a remarkable coincidence, he was born on the 3rd of August, 1819, and on the same date of August, 1847, he took charge of Hutchins School as Rector, and he had the privilege of passing some of his schoolboy days under the care of his gifted uncle, Dr. Arnold, at Rugby, and at the age of seventeen entered as a student at Christ Church College, Oxford. After obtaining his degree he left England for this colony, where he arrived in the beginning of 1843. For some time he filled the appointment of second master of the Queen's School, then under the chief superintendence of the Rev. J. P. Gell. This institution soon after collapsed, and Mr. Buckland then opened a private school. Having been ordained by Dr. Nixon, he for some time administered the cure of Richmond, from which he was transferred to the Hitchings School in August 1847 as Head Master. How the institution became distinguished as one of the best classical schools in all the Australian colonies under the management of the

deceased Rector, it is unnecessary to remind colonists of the passing and present generations. ...

The reverend gentleman breathed his last at an early hour yesterday morning, the melancholy incident being notified to the public by the lowering of the flags of the shipping in the harbour to halfmast.

Mr. Charles Thomas Buckland, who died in London on March 21st, at the age of 70, was a distinguished member of the Bengal Civil Service. The son of the Rev. John Buckland, he was a nephew of Dr. Buckland, Dean of Westminster, and therefore first cousin to the celebrated naturalist, Frank Buckland. Born at Laleham, he was educated at Eton, and completed a good record there by gaining an Indian writership, which had been offered by the Chairman of the Court of Directors, Mr. W. Butterworth Bayley. Mr. Buckland proceeded to the East Indian Company's College at Haileybury, where he carried off all the classical prizes of his term, and became captain of boats. He also obtained prizes for Sanskrit and English composition. He went out to India in 1844, and in a few years was selected for employment in the Bengal Secretariat under Sir Frederick Halliday, first Lieutenant Governor of Bengal. His subsequent career was a notable one, and he ably held numerous high appointments in succession. Ultimately he became a member of the Board of Revenue, when he was also appointed a member of the Lieutenant-Governor's Council, and was Chairman of the Calcutta Port Trust. He shared in the devotion of his cousin to natural history; and, having been one of the first promoters of the now flourishing Zoological Garden of Calcutta, was president of its committee. He never ceased to take a keen interest in it [sic] welfare, and on his retirement after 37 years' service he devoted much of his leisure to writing interesting papers on the wild animals of Bengal. Mr. Buckland married, in 1845, one of the daughters of the late Sir Henry Ricketts.

DEATH OF A DEVOTED NATURALIST. The death took place last night at Harting, Sussex, of Prebendary Henry Doddridge Gordon, the rector and vicar so well known for his enthusiastic study of natural history. He was a member of the Aberdeen family, and his mother was the descendant of the famous Dr. Doddridge. Before going to Winchester he went to school at Rose Hill, where Charles Reade was, and when he was at Winchester the present Bishop of Southwell was head of the school. When he matriculated at University College, Oxford, Dean Stanley examined him. He migrated to New, and in 1858 was ordained by Bishop Wilberforce, by whose influence, and that of Sir Roderick Murchison, he was presented by Lady Fetherstonhaugh to Harting, where he has been for thirty-three years. In 1892 Bishop Durnford gave him one of the Wykehamical Stalls at Chichester. He married, in 1860, Elizabeth Oke, second daughter of Dean Buckland, and Frank Buckland, therefore, was his brother-in-law. Living in the district immortalised by Gilbert White, he devoted many hours to the study of his loved birds and writing and lecturing on them, and at meetings of the Selborne Society he was one of the greatest authorities. He kept a minute record of bird movements, and had a wonderful power of imparting his enthusiasm to others, and fostered a habit of observation which sometimes exhibited itself in unexpected quarters. He was a voluminous correspondent as to natural history and a constant contributor to the Press on his favourite subject.

The announcement of the death of Mrs. Frank Buckland at the advanced age ninety-one will recall many memories of her famous husband, to whose enthusiasm and untiring efforts, says the Field, the salmon and freshwater fisheries of this country owe much. It is not, perhaps, generally known to the younger generation that Buckland was for some years in close connection with the Field, lacing a regular contributor from 1856 to 1865, and for some part of the time on the editorial staff. In 1866, having left the Field, he was one of the group of men who started Land and Water, to which he contributed practically till the close his life in 1880.

Mrs. Buckland, who before her marriage was Miss Hannah Papes, joined her fortunes to his while was still the Field, in 1863, and she must have had an exciting time of it among all his strange pets. The Electoral Register for Marlborough, New Zealand shows that he was living there as a "cable operator" in 1890.
