About Natstand family documents:

A Natstand family document is intended to provide background information concerning the family of a deceased naturalist. It is hoped that such information will form a framework which will help interpret their surviving correspondence, specimens and records. In some cases it will also give an insight into the influences on their early lives and the family constraints within which they worked and collected. We have found that published family data concerning individuals rarely contain justification for dates and relationships and not infrequently contain errors which are then perpetuated. The emphasis in Natstand family documents will be on providing references to primary sources, whenever possible, which will be backed-up with transcriptions.

Although a Natstand biography page will always carry a link to a family document, in many cases these documents will be presented without any further biographical material. We anticipate that this will occur if the person is particularly well known or is someone we are actively researching or have only a peripheral interest in.

The following conventions are used:

Any persons in the family tree with known natural history associations will be indicated in red type. Any relationships will be to the root naturalist unless otherwise stated.

Dates are presented Year – Month – Day

e.g. **1820 March 9** or **1820.3.9**
1820 March or **1820.3**

Dates will be shown in bold type if a reliable reference is presented in the document. In cases where an exact year cannot be given (e.g. it is derived from an age at death), the date will be presented in normal type and preceded with "c" – e.g. c1798. There are some cases where a date is available from a secondary source only (e.g. a published obituary), in these cases it will be presented in italics – e.g. *1823.7.21*

Data sources:

Census data have been used, whenever possible, to confirm relationships; they are not considered a reliable source of data concerning age. Contemporary newspaper family notices are considered as reliable sources of relationships and dates; reports and obituaries are treated more cautiously. Parish records generally provide a reliable source of data and digitised images have been used whenever possible. Any difficulties with transcription will be made clear. In some cases only transcripts have been available; errors here are usually confined to spelling. The most important source of this material is the International Genealogical Index compiled by The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints, Utah. National Civil Registration Indexes are considered reliable, as are probate records.

"The Bampton Lectures having been wholly delivered by him, and with what erudite soundness, ability, and force, we shall doubtless soon hear, Mr. Conybeare had but recently quitted Oxford, and repaired for few days to the house of friend near London, previously to returning to his pastoral duty, when he was seized with a fit of apoplexy, and on the next day expired! Whether as a divine, a scholar, a man of universal science (though distinguishingly eminent as a chemist, mineralogist, and geologist, well a Saxon scholar), or of exquisite taste and vertu, he bore a station transcendently high, attained but few; whilst, in liberality of sentiment every view considered, philanthropy, and benevolence, and, to use an often repeated favourite word with himself, as if allied to and naturally emanating from his correspondent character, pure, genuine single-heartedness, if not unparalleled[sic], he was surpassed by none. His heart always appeared pregnant with native goodness, and his mind with pious purity."

DEATHS ... On Wednesday, at Weybridge, the Rev. William John Conybeare, M.A. Mr Conybeare, who was a son of the Very Rev. W. D. Conybeare, M.A., the venerable Dean of Llandaff, was born in 1815, and took his degree at Cambridge in 1837, as thirty-third wrangler. In 1848, Mr Conybeare was presented by his father to the vicarage of Axminster, with the curacies of Kilmington and Membury, Devonshire (value £975), but was compelled by ill health to resign that benefice in 1855. Mr is well known in literary circles as a writer on ecclesiastical affairs. His article on " Church Parties," in the Edinburgh Review, some two or three years ago, caused considerable sensation by its lashing, humorous style, under which much of truth might be discovered in his dissection of both the great parties in the Church. His novel "Perversion" was the target for plenty of the "odium theologicum," and doubtless, as the author gave no quarter to any religious or political party, he could expect none himself, but its ability is undoubted whatever thin-skinned critics may say. His literary performance of a less ephemeral character is his work on the "Life and Writings of St Paul," which he produced in conjunction with the Rev J S Howson, principal of the Liverpool Collegiate School.

MARRIAGE OF MR. PEARCE EDGCUMBE AND MISS CONSTANCE CONYBEARE.

Saturday last the little village Fryerning was early astir on the occasion of the marriage of Mr. Pearce Edgcumbe, only son of Mr. Edward Pearce, of Somerleigh, Dorchester, to Miss Constance Conybeare, youngest daughter of the late Mr. John Charles Conybeare, of St. Leonard's Grange, Fryerning. In consequence of the recent death of the bride's father the wedding was of a very quiet character, and the invitations were restricted to the nearest relations. The absence of bridesmaids might almost have passed without notice, as their place was in measure filled by Miss Conybeare's class of 20 young girls, whom the bride had helped to teach, and who, dressed in light colours, carried baskets of flowers with which they strewed the path from the church. Few prettier sights could be seen than the group in the little churchyard on that sunny morning. The church, which, with its red brick battlemented tower, stands most picturesquely among sombre and aged fir and yew trees on the top of a gently rising hill, was filled with friends and neighbours, rich and poor. The chancel was decorated with plants of lilies and ferns grouped within the altar rails, while on the altar were vases and a cross of lovely flowers. Shortly before eleven o'clock Mr. Pearce Edgcumbe arrived accompanied by his best man, Mr. Henry Adkins, of Ley Hill, Worcestershire, and soon afterwards the bride, leaning on the arm of her eldest brother, Mr. C. A. V. Conybeare, entered the church. She wore a rich ivory white brocade bodice and train, the jupe of Surah silk with lace flounces. Her tulle veil, over wreath of orange flowers, was fastened with a diamond spray, the gift of her uncle, Captain Vansittart. The Rev. T. P. Ferguson, rector of Shenfield, an old of the bride's father, officiated, assisted

Rev. Henry Barff. The bride was given away, by Mr. C. A. V. Conybeare. At the close of the ceremony the "Wedding march" was played and the bells rang out a merry peal. The company, after a stroll through the pleasant grounds of St. Leonard's Grange, assembled in the dining-room, where a recherche breakfast was laid. The cake was surmounted with the bride's bouquet, and the table was adorned with choice flowers. The company present were Mr. and Mrs. Pearce (the bridegroom's father and mother), Miss Pearce, Miss C. J. Pearce, Miss Conybeare, General Conybeare, Mr. and Mrs. F. C. Conybeare, Miss Vansittart, Mr. Adkins, Mr. C. A. V. Conybeare, Mr. H. G. M. Conybeare, the Rev. T. P. Ferguson, Mr. and Mrs. F. Hore, and the Rev. H. Barff. The bride and bridegroom left during the afternoon for Dover en route for the Continent. Mr. Pearce Edgcumbe is a barrister, practising on the Western Circuit, and is one of the official examiners to the High Court of Justice.
