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About Natstand family documents:

A Natstand family document is intended to provide background information concerning the family of a deceased naturalist. It is hoped that such information will form a framework which will help interpret their surviving correspondence, specimens and records. In some cases it will also give an insight into the influences on their early lives and the family constraints within which they worked and collected. We have found that published family data concerning individuals rarely contain justification for dates and relationships and not infrequently contain errors which are then perpetuated. The emphasis in Natstand family documents will be on providing references to primary sources, whenever possible, which will be backed-up with transcriptions.

Although a Natstand biography page will always carry a link to a family document, in many cases these documents will be presented without any further biographical material. We anticipate that this will occur if the person is particularly well known or is someone we are actively researching or have only a peripheral interest in.

The following conventions are used:

Any persons in the family tree with known natural history associations will be indicated in red type. Any relationships will be to the root naturalist unless otherwise stated.

Dates are presented Year – Month – Day

e.g. **1820 March 9** or **1820.3.9**
1820 March or **1820.3**

Dates will be shown in bold type if a reliable reference is presented in the document. In cases where an exact year cannot be given (e.g. it is derived from an age at death), the date will be presented in normal type and preceded with "c" – e.g. c1798. There are some cases where a date is available from a secondary source only (e.g. a published obituary), in these cases it will be presented in italics – e.g. *1823.7.21*

Data sources:

Census data have been used, whenever possible, to confirm relationships; they are not considered a reliable source of data concerning age. Contemporary newspaper family notices are considered as reliable sources of relationships and dates; reports and obituaries are treated more cautiously. Parish records generally provide a reliable source of data and digitised images have been used whenever possible. Any difficulties with transcription will be made clear. In some cases only transcripts have been available; errors here are usually confined to spelling. The most important source of this material is the International Genealogical Index compiled by The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints, Utah. National Civil Registration Indexes are considered reliable, as are probate records.

Alban Edward Lomax

1894 Journal of Botany: Britten 384

ALBAN EDWARD LOMAX died of a cerebral inflammation at Liverpool on May 4th, at the early age of Thirty-three. He was the son of a Cannon of Ely, and settled in Liverpool as a pharmaceutical chemist, holding also the post of dispenser at the Northern Dispensary. Modest and retiring by nature, he led a secluded though active life, the whole of his leisure being devoted to botanical pursuits. He was an early riser, and much of his local botany was done before folk in general were up. He had a valuable herbarium, which was purchased at his death by the University of Liverpool; a large number of the specimens were obtained by exchange, Mr Lomax having had an extensive correspondence with Continental and American botanists. He spent his holidays in some unfrequented locality on the Continent, principally in Spain, from which country he described a new Cerastium in this Journal for 1893 (p331), his only contribution to our pages. He published notes from time to time in Science Gossip, and was an active member of the Watson Exchange Club.

Ray Desmond starts his discussion of Alban Edward Lomax with the statement "Nephew of E. A. Lomax (1810 – 1895)" – referring to Elizabeth Anne Lomax - in his first edition of *Dictionary of British and Irish botanists and horticulturalists* (1977). This relationship is widely quoted after this – an exception being Kent and Allen (1984). The page in this latter work giving the publishing history shows that it is considered a development, and essentially a further edition, of Britten & Boulger's *Biographical Index of British and Irish Botanists*, first published as a single volume in 1893. This was then revised and added to by Rendle in 1931.

Brittain and Boulger, writing only a short time after the close deaths of these two botanists make no mention of any association.

Investigations for this pedigree have not revealed connection between the two families and it is postulated that the link arose as a result of confusion of their initials – A E LOMAX and E A LOMAX - in herbarium catalogues which may have led to an assumption that they were collecting in the same place at the same time.

It has been considered useful to include a pedigree of his mother's family - the Cox family of Bingham, Nottingham and Liverpool - as the Lomax and Cox families were very closely associated with marriages and shared ancestors.

Mama's name was **Marianne Dorothea** she was born in the year 29th of August 1789 the only daughter by the second marriage of **George Lissant Cox and Mary Barker**. [Note in margin ; see all Mr. Jerram's letters in the Mahogany Book]Mamma [the word she is crossed out] had two brothers one born in*

[blank space waiting for entry of place] died in the very flower of his youth at the Rev. and Charles Jerram's he was as clever as Mamma and they were of one mind on religion - his illness was short. my Grandmamma was inconsolable her whole heart was wrapped up in her boy - two years afterwards another was given her so that I had an own Uncle one year older than myself - but he too died suddenly at school at Southeade [not sure on spelling of place name] aged 16.
