About Natstand family documents:

A Natstand family document is intended to provide background information concerning the family of a deceased naturalist. It is hoped that such information will form a framework which will help interpret their surviving correspondence, specimens and records. In some cases it will also give an insight into the influences on their early lives and the family constraints within which they worked and collected. We have found that published family data concerning individuals rarely contain justification for dates and relationships and not infrequently contain errors which are then perpetuated. The emphasis in Natstand family documents will be on providing references to primary sources, whenever possible, which will be backed-up with transcriptions.

Although a Natstand biography page will always carry a link to a family document, in many cases these documents will be presented without any further biographical material. We anticipate that this will occur if the person is particularly well known or is someone we are actively researching or have only a peripheral interest in.

The following conventions are used:

Any persons in the family tree with known natural history associations will be indicated in red type. Any relationships will be to the root naturalist unless otherwise stated.

Dates are presented Year – Month – Day

e.g. **1820 March 9** or **1820.3.9**
1820 March or **1820.3**

Dates will be shown in bold type if a reliable reference is presented in the document. In cases where an exact year cannot be given (e.g. it is derived from an age at death), the date will be presented in normal type and preceded with "c" – e.g. c1798. There are some cases where a date is available from a secondary source only (e.g. a published obituary), in these cases it will be presented in italics – e.g. *1823.7.21*

Data sources:

Census data have been used, whenever possible, to confirm relationships; they are not considered a reliable source of data concerning age. Contemporary newspaper family notices are considered as reliable sources of relationships and dates; reports and obituaries are treated more cautiously. Parish records generally provide a reliable source of data and digitised images have been used whenever possible. Any difficulties with transcription will be made clear. In some cases only transcripts have been available; errors here are usually confined to spelling. The most important source of this material is the International Genealogical Index compiled by The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints, Utah. National Civil Registration Indexes are considered reliable, as are probate records.

The Strickland family of Boynton, Yorkshire, had a long interest in natural history. An early member of the family, William Strickland (- 1598) is credited with introducing the Turkey to England; the "turkey cock in his pride" featured as a crest on the Strickland arms.

This pedigree was constructed to show the relationship of **Hugh Edwin Strickland** (1811 – 1853) to the Stricklands of Boynton, Yorkshire. He was the grandson of Sir George Strickland, the 5th Baronet, Hugh's father being the youngest son. He is best known as an ornithologist and geologist and in 1832 he married Catherine Dorcas Maule, the daughter of Sir William Jardine. He died tragically in 1853 while examining a railway cutting near Retford.

Other significant naturalists in this pedigree are **Strickland Freeman** (1754 – 1821) and his cousins (and also sisters in law) **Charlotte** (1758 - 1833) and **Julia Sabina Strickland** (1765 - 1849). Strickland Freeman, along with Dr George Shaw, had edited *Selected specimens of British plants*, his cousins supplying the superlative illustrations. The Misses Strickland lived with their youngest brother (Hugh Edwin's father) at Apperley Court, Gloucestershire.

On Tuesday last an inquest was taken at Waldringfield, in Suffolk, on view of the body of James Calder, Esq. late paymaster of the 21st regiment of light dragoons, who was drowned in Woodbridge river on Tuesday the 25th ult. by a sail boat being upset, and sunk. Jurors' verdict, accidental death. And on Wednesday evening the remains of Captain Calder were interred at Woodbridge with military honours; attended by the whole of the 21st light dragoons, and the officers of the artillery belonging to the garrison. The volunteers belonging to that place were drawn up at the end of the town, on each side of the road, recumbent on their inverted pieces, for the melancholy procession to pass through, and fell in the rear. The concourse of people, which the much lamented catastrophe, the respect in which Captain Calder was held, and the impressive solemnity of an officer's funeral, had drawn together, was very great. Captain Calder was extremely beloved by his acquaintance. He was a native of Scotland, and originally educated for the church. He was only 32 years of age; had served in the West Indies, and attained the rank of Captain before he joined the 21st light dragoons as paymaster. He married Miss Strickland, of Boynton Hall, in Yorkshire, whom he has left with three children to lament his fate. Her grief is not to be described.

He was born in the year 1782, and had ther fore attained the patriarchal age of 92 years. He was the oldest son of the late Sir William Strickland, Bart., by Henrietta, daughter of Nathanel Cholmley Esq., of Whitby and Howstam[sic], Yorkshire. He succeeded to the title in 1834. but exchanged his family name to Cholmley in 1861. The late Sir George was a Deputy-Lieutenant for the East Riding of Yorkshire. and once represented the West Riding and then the borough of Preston in Parliament. killed him. This gentleman was the eldest surviving son of Henry E. Strickland, Esq., of Apperley Court, and had he out-lived his father, would have inherited a large property. Ever since this terrible occurrence, the widow of Mr Hugh Strickland had resided for a considerable part of the year at Apperley Court, although for some years past she possessed a house of her own at Cambridge. Her husband's fine ornithological collection had been presented, after his death, to Cambridge University, and Mrs Strickland had taken a great interest in the arrangement of the specimens and the forming of their printed catalogue. Several years ago the late Miss Frances Strickland endowed a Curatorship in connection with her brother's collection of birds as presented to the University. Mrs Hugh E. Strickland was the second daughter the late Sir William Jardine, Bart, of Jardine Hall, Dumfriesshire, the well known ornithologist and editor of the voluminous "Naturalists' Library." In a sermon preached last Sunday by the Vicar of Deerhurst, in the chapel of Apperley (erected by Henry E Strickland, Esq., and considerably improved within the last twelve months by Mrs Hugh Strickland), the preacher made allusion the tragic circumstances connected with the respective endings of life - removed the one from the other by the long interval of 36 years - of husband and widow.

HANDSOME BEQUEST TO BATH. A SKETCH THE BENEFACTRESS.

With reference paragraph which first appeared Friday's "Daily Chronicle" announcing that by the death of a lady living in Bath the city would come into possession several thousand pounds, to be devoted towards the establishment of an Art Gallery, it may be stated that in addition to this bequest this lady has also made provision in her will for many charities, including several in our own city. Mrs. Arabella Roxburgh, the lady referred to, died at the advanced of 83 years, and has been well known to some citizens for her quiet and unostentatious charity, while many of the poor have received the benefits of her generosity without knowing even her name, for she loved to give anonymously. She was a grand-daughter of Sir Charles [This should have said George] Strickland (fifth baronet), of Boynton-hall, Yorkshire. Her mother, Sophia Letitia Strickland, was twice married, first to Captain James Calder (son of Admiral Sir William Calder), and on his death by drowning, in the year 1805, to Mr. William Glascott, of the 16th Dragoon Guards. She first met Mr. Glascott at a ball in Bath in the year 1807 and the marriage took place privately in Liverpool in April, 1808. Mr. Glascott was very shortly after the marriage ordered to the Peninsular War, and his wife followed him to Spain, suffering great privations the journey. One of the children was born near Lisbon shortly after the mother's arrival. The marriage proved an unhappy one. Of the two children one, Arabella, remained for time with her father, and was subsequently adopted by her aunts, the Misses Strickland, of Apperley Court, Gloucestershire, whilst the other, Strickland Glascott, resided with the mother. Arabella married, in April, 1838, Mr. Adam Roxburgh, of Manchester, and afterwards of Glasgow. A son, the only issue of the marriage, died many years ago. On her husband's death, Mrs. Roxburgh travelled for time, and afterwards settled in Bath. She took a great interest in the Technical Schools of Bath, and provided some scholarships. She also gave some pictures to the city, in the hope that they might form beginning for Art Gallery. Down to within the last few years her means were limited, and there was a difficulty establishing her title to large family property by reason of the privacy of her parents' marriage and the absence the usual proofs of the legitimate birth of her children. These evidences were, however, obtained, a Decree of the Court of Chancery was pronounced, and the money was paid over by the persons accountable. Mrs. Roxburgh did not alter her style of living, but devoted the entire income of this accession of wealth to charitable objects, the Royal United Hospital, Dr. Barnardo's Homes, and the Bath Branch of the Young Men's Christian Association being amongst the institutions benefited.

MEMORIAL SERVICE. In connection with the death of the late Mrs. Roxburgh the funeral service was held Argyle Chapel on Thursday afternoon. The Rev. J, Turner- Smith officiated, and among the congregation were many regular attendants at Argyle, to whom Mrs. Roxburgh was well known. Those present included Mr. Francis Ferguson, Glasgow; the Rev. Robert Ewing, of Trowbridge; Miss Ferguson, of Newcastle, great nephews and
